## Golden Threads:

Settlement- A community in which people live. Diversity- A variety of people from different ethnicities or backgrounds.

Essential Vocabulary	
hill fort	A settlement found on a hill surrounded by well defended walls.
residence	A building that a person lives in.
recreational	A place where people go for enjoyment.
business	Where something is sold to people to make money.
city	A large settlement which has lots of people who live and work in it.
green spaces	A land area which has a lot of plants eg, fields and forests.
transport	A way of travelling from one place to another.
skyscraper	A tall building of many storeys.
urban	Used to describe places or things from in a city.
rural	Used to describe places and things not in cities.
town	A medium sized settlement, which a few people live and work in.

Questions	Essential Knowledge
How did early man use land to help their settlements in the Stone age and the Iron Age?	In the new Stone Age people started to cut back trees and build fences to split up land. Iron Age settlements included hill forts which were easily defended.
How can land be used in different ways?	Land can be used for lots of different things. Residence, recreation, business and services like hospitals and schools.
How is land in the local area used?	In Hulme, there is lots of residences where people live. There are shops and supermarkets. There are also some green spaces for recreation.
How is land in Greater Manchester used?	Greater Manchester is a large city, this has a lot of land used for residence, shopping and business. There are some green spaces. There is also space for public transport as well as roads and parking.
How is land in the Lake district used?	In the Lake District there is not much public transport, there is much more green space. Buildings are mostly residential with small shops.
How has land use changed over the last 100 years?	Land use has changed a lot. With more space for cars and parking taking over cities. There are fewer factories and more skyscrapers.
