erosion	When parts of rock breaks off the side of a cliff due to being hit repeatedly.
transportation	Moving sediment or small rocks from one place to another.
deposition	Letting sediment or rocks fall to the bed of a river or sea because they are too heavy or the river is too slow.
sediment	Fine grains of rock which have been broken up by erosion.
habitat	A place where animals live.
development	A place that has been built up by humans.

Where were the first 4 ancient civilisations and what did they have in common?	The Shang Dynasty - China - River Huang He Ancient Indus Valley - North East Pakistan - River Indus Ancient Sumer - Iraq and Iran - Tigris and Euphrates Ancient Egypt - Egypt - The Nile They all were on a river for transport and trade.
How do coasts change over time?	Coasts are made bigger through deposition of transported rock and sand. They are decreased through erosion.
What are the human and physical features of a coastline?	Human features are ports and piers. Physical features are estuaries, bays, arches, stacks, caves and cliffs.
Why are coastlines important and need to be protected?	Coastlines are important places for settlement, but also provide good habitats for animals. They need to be protected as they are being destroyed by erosion.
