Skills

- Observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into plants.
- Classify seeds and bulbs.
- Find out and describe how plants need water, light and the right temperature to grow and stay healthy.

Knowledge

- Can describe how plants that they have grown from seeds and bulbs have developed over time.
- Can identify plants that grow well in different conditions, for example, some need sun and some need shade.

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Key vocabulary

leaf	A part of a plant.
flower	A part of a plant where seeds grow.
blossom	The flowers on a plant.
petal	Part of a flower.
fruit	The part of the plant where seeds are made.
berry	A small fruit.
root	Part of the plant which grows into the ground.
seed	Part of a plant which can grow into another plant.
trunk	The main stem of a tree.
branch	Part of a tree which grows from the trunk.
stem	The plant's body.
bark	The outside layer of a tree.
bud	Part of a plant that is growing into a leaf or flower.



Facts

Plants grow from seeds or bulbs. These germinate and grow into seedlings which grow into plants. Plants may have flowers, seeds, berries and fruits.

Seeds and bulbs need to be planted outside at particular times of the year and they will germinate and grow at different speeds.

Some plants are better suited to growing in the sun and some grow better in shade.

Plants need different amounts of water and space to grow well and stay healthy.
