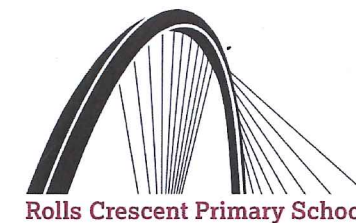

Focus on the children as individuals (yr3) My child is pushed and challenged (yr4) I am pleased my child's homework is checked (yr4) The team inspire the pupils to do work at home (yr5) The interventions make a difference (yr5) Staff are caring and responsible (yr6)
When thinking about your child's experiences at Rolls Crescent is there anything we can do better?
More attention to PE (yr3) Action: We are now trying to implement the Primary PE passport programme to help develop PE throughout school.
More work on team work and honesty (yr3) Action: We have refreshed our Kagan approach this year promoting engagement and team work in class groups. Our UNICEF rights responsibility reward helps deliver messages on honesty and working as a team. We will hold more assemblies with the theme of honesty.
More programmes for the new to English students. (yr4) Action: We have extended the hours of our bi-lingual teaching assistant who is now able to deliver more programmes to new to English students. We are developing a welcome learning pack for our new pupils who come to school with no or little English
Email letters to parents as paper copies don't always make it home. (yr5) Action: We will continue to put key letters on our website in the parents section. We will try to collect as many emails as possible at the next parents evening to send more letters by email.
More cycle storage (yr5) Action: We have no plans to place more cycle storage around school just at the moment due to funding restrictions. We may try to look at this issue again in the new academic year if the existing shelters are used to capacity.
Wider variety of clubs including academic clubs eg handwriting club (yr6) Action: We hold many clubs every day after school, we are trying to introduce a wider variety at different times. This includes a chess club and a year 5 times tables club.

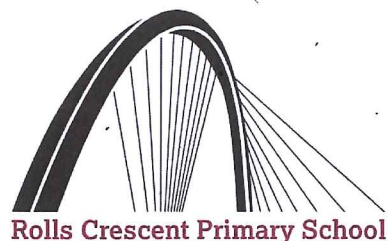

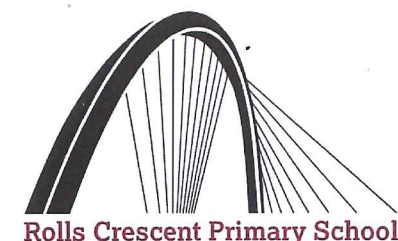

You can see more about the days learning tasks when you drop off your children in the morning. Reception homework helps consolidate learning taking place in class. Parents need even more support to support our children with work at home. Action: Thank you to all the parents who attended our recent phonics workshop. We will continue to hold workshops to give our parents support. We will be holding a maths workshop next term. More nursery homework. Action: The nursery team continue to prepare little home tasks related to the nursery topic. Please try to listen to your children read regularly with the books we send home. Thanks to all the parents who have been able to email pictures and log in to the school interactive learning diary with photos and comments about the activities your children are enjoying at home.

We have enjoyed the different workshops The children as storytellers project in year 1 The staff are very organised
When thinking about your child's experiences at Rolls Crescent is there anything we can do better?
We would like to have more transparency with what the children are learning. Action: Key stage 1 teachers will ensure parents are sent medium term plans each half term so you can see the intended learning. We would like our child to have more challenge in maths (y1) Action: Key stage 1 would like to discuss challenge through mastery in maths with our key stage 1 parents. We will be holding a parent workshop on this matter next term. We would like more meetings with teachers Action: We will continue to offer three statutory meetings throughout the school year. Key stage 1 are holding more parent workshops where parents can discuss and learn how to support their children. If you have specific issues you want to discuss about your child please try to arrange an appointment with your child's class teacher. More after school homework with a homework club Action: We are unable to offer more homework clubs at this moment but will consider the capacity to do so in our plans for the future.
