As many of you will be aware from our last edition of ELFS News (New Year 2015), Manchester City Council (MCC) had tough budget decisions to make in this financial year 2015/16. Child Accident Prevention Education (Injury Minimization Programme for Schools (I.M.P.S.) & Early Learning for Safety (ELFS)) was one of the "at risk" programmes.

There was strong support for both I.M.P.S. & ELFS to continue in MCC schools and children's centres. Child Safety Week 2015 Theme: "Tea-time Terrors!"

Child Safety Week is an annual campaign run by the Child Accident Prevention Trust (CAPT) to raise awareness of the risks of child accidents and how they can be prevented.

The 2015 theme focuses on accidents that can happen at tea-time, when parental pressures are at their peak.

Discussion ideas from CAPT include:

- Burns from cookers or scalds from spillages that happen while parents are distracted.
- Poisonings from oven cleaner, or other hazardous household products left in the shopping bag on the floor.
- Road accidents caused during the busy home time chaos.

ELFS Extras - What the hospital health educators cover in the children's workshop


 Talking about (& dressing the children up as) professionals who help to keep us safe and well.

It really helps us to effectively deliver the children's workshops if we can have a separate room, or area away from the main activity of the class, and an adult who knows the children sitting in.

ELFS parent/carer workshop

Schools/centres need to sign up at least 10 parents/carers to be considered for this.

We ...

- Discuss health services that are available in the event of ill health or injury (promotion of the NHS Choose Well campaign).
- Provide an Opportunity to watch and discuss the RoSPA Safe at Home DVD.
- Demonstrate and talk about how to manage serious bleeding, choking and the unconscious casualty.
- Assist and encourage parents/carers to practice resuscitation techniques (chest compressions and rescue breaths) on baby & child/adult manikins.

It's informal and interactive and parents/carers get a small "goody bag" containing information and resources to help prevent some of the more serious, common accidental injuries in 3 to 5 year olds
