
# What is at the ends of the Earth? Ask Year 2!

Year 2 have made a great start to the new school year. They have been enjoying their new Topic 'What is at the Ends of the Earth' and learning about the animals that live there, their habitats and how they have adapted to survive there.

In English they are learning to write an Arctic story with capital letters and correct punctuation, and in Maths they are learning different strategies to add and subtract. Year 2 have really enjoyed Outdoor games and working with the Manchester United coaches to improve their skills.

### Year 3 - back to the Stone Age

Year 3 have had a brilliant start to the new school year, in art we have been making replica stone age axes using clay. In English we then wrote instructions to tell Year 2 children how they could make their own. We set up our own caves in the classroom and spent a dark afternoon creating our own cave art. To contrast with our own drawings we also worked in our Computing sessions to create Cave Art using the computers. We are planning a visit to Manchester Museum soon so look out for a letter coming home.







Don't forget that we have breakfast club every morning from 8am to 8.45am serving toast, cereal, fruit, as well as hot and cold drinks. Children need to be dropped off and it costs £1.00 each day.

#### It's all Greek in Year 4!

This half term Year 4 have kicked off the new school year in Ancient Greece. We have been learning about the differences between Athens and Sparta and trying to decide which was best. In English we are writing myths of our own after reading Theseus and the Minotaur. We have designed and made our own shields and swords in Art and Design and Technology and we have been learning about Sound in Science. Last week we had a very interesting day when an Ancient Greek soldier found himself at Rolls Crescent for the day! He showed the children a game and puzzle played in Ancient Greece, we acted out a myth, completed a Greek quiz and then finished off the day learning all about the armour and weapons of an Ancient Greek soldier. Everyone (children and adults) really enjoyed the day and we all found out lots of new facts. What a brilliant start to a new school year!
