Year 1

In year 1 we have been focussing on our new routines and getting settled in our classrooms. We have done teambuilding activities to get to know each other and learned our classroom expectations, can your child tell you our 3 expectations?

We are also focusing on our value this half term, 'responsibility' and encouraging children to be independent in their learning.

In Science, children have enjoyed learning about different parts of a plant and we have explored the school grounds to find



different leaves. We looked at similarities and differences in the leaves we found. We will be going on a trip to Hulme Garden Centre this half term to enhance our learning about plants.

Here are some pictures of children enjoying our Science lesson.

Class 5

In English, we are reading Queen of the Falls, which is about the daredevil Annie Edison Taylor who went over Niagara Falls in a barrel. We have been writing letters in role and will retell the story of her life. In Science, we are completing a unit of work about Forces and the children have come up with some great questions about leavers and pulleys and where they might be found.

In RE, we are finding out about the ways Hindus can show commitment to their faith. At the start of this year, we have a big focus on teamwork and strategy in our PE lessons. The children have worked well and risen to the challenges. Our invasion games have begun with netball and applying learnt skills to game situations. The beginning of Year 5 sees us explore a new Geography topic all about the Great Lakes in North America and The Lake District in Northwest England. We will be exploring a lot of maps and comparing different regions. In PSHE, we have set goals and looked at the Rights of the Child according to the United Nations.



In Maths, we are using our knowledge of place value to read, write and compare some really big numbers – up to one million! Next we will be moving onto rounding before revisiting addition and subtraction.



National Anti-bullying week is 14th November to 18th November. We will begin with an odd socks day.




In Year 6 this half term we have been looking at the artwork of David Hockey and produced landscapes pictures looking utilising his style.

Year Four have all started the Year very well. We had a very enjoyable trip to the Art Gallery to hear a storyteller tell us one of Roald Dahl's short stories. We have been leaning about the Ancient Greeks and the children attended a trip to Manchester Art Gallery where an artist and storyteller explained the story of the battle of Troy. The children were very engaged and enjoyed themselves. In Science we have been learning about Electricity, where we have made circuits, switches and investigated whether materials are

Year 3 We have had a great start to the school year. We have worked hard on being independent and all children are trying hard to do well with this.


In our maths we are working on numbers up to 1000 and the children have been looking at ones, tens and hundreds using different physical concrete resources and also abstract written methods to show their understanding. In English we have introduced the children to the text 'Seal Surfer' which is a narrative about the relationship between a little boy and a seal. Our two big questions are 'What changed from Old Stone Age to the New'

Stone Age? and in Science What do animals and humans actually need?' In history lessons we have created an understanding of the three time zones of the stone age historical era, we have addressed language such as pre-historic and artifacts etc. We have looked at looking at clues and evidence about how they lived and work around settlement.

In Science we have looked at food groups and the importance of a balanced diet and understanding how important it is to look after our body. We have touched on heart health and exercise and started looking at the body's bones and muscles.

We are really pleased with how the Reception children have settled into school during these first few weeks of term. The children have been exploring and playing so nicely in the different areas of the classroom. This half term, we have been answering our big question "Would you like to hear about me?", where we have been talking about ourselves and our families and have been trying to describe ourselves and our friends. We have been exploring our forest area and outdoor classroom and we have been collecting leaves, sticks, conkers and crab apples. We used them to make patterns and an autumn investigation area! We also collected leaves that we used to make our Harvest signs for our Harvest celebration!

Next half term our big question is "Where does this animal come from?", where we are going to look at different animals and the environments they live in.
