Year 1

In the first two weeks of school we focused a lot on our emotions and settling back into school life. We collected our work and made a class scrap book which you can see by scanning the OR Code.

In Year 1 we are improving our outdoor area. The children have enjoyed investigating our new resources.

We have been looking carefully at plants and naming the parts of a plant in Science. We have encouraged this learning outside in our investigation area as you can see in the picture.

We have also been mark making and building our gross motor skills to improve our writing. We make big marks with the paint brushes on the wall and also draw and write in chalks on the floor.

We are using our new equipment such as stilts, which help us with our balance and concentration.

We are learning how to play games on the floor markings in the playground, such as counting forwards and backwards on the hopscotch. This also encourages us to communicate with our peers and talk about the games we are playing together.





In Geography for our big question, 'Why Do We Love Manchester?' we have used the iPads to explore the school grounds and the surrounding areas on google earth and google maps. The children enjoyed finding local landmarks as well.

synonyms and antonyms. Can you spot the antonyms in the title? We made predictions based on the picture...What do you think the book might be about?



Year 4


The main topic for this term in Year Four is: 'How is Llandudno different from Manchester?' In our Science our focus is Electricity and the children have already enjoyed trying to make circuits to make bulbs light. Linked with both these topics, in DT we are making fairground rides. The children have really enjoyed their swimming lessons, where

they have been fantastic, all children have tried hard in these and had a lot of fun.

Our current topic is 'How has Manchester changed since the year 2000?' Children have worked really hard on this and we have spent two weeks looking at transport and one week so far looking at the Beetham Tower. On transport we look at what it is? Why we need it? and what would happen if we did not have it? We looked at the changes in Manchester transport since 1999 to the present. We looked at how the tram system has evolved and also the digital technology changes such as wifi on transport and contactless payment.

We have loved our science so far the children's knowledge has already been very good but they have made real progress in the three lessons we have had so far. Our big question is 'What do animals and humans actually need?' We have been looking at balanced diets and the five food types and have moved on to muscles and bones which has really engaged them. The children have a good understanding and we are really happy about their knowledge and we just hope they will use this knowledge in their own lives.

Year 3 have started their new French and music curriculum off really well and we hope these continues in to the year.

We are very proud of how our Reception children have settled back into school after being off for such a long time. We have welcomed lots of new children from different nurseries too, and they are all doing so well at getting used to our class routines and rules.

In the last few weeks we have been getting used to using our new online learning platform, Seesaw.
